Dear Parents/Guardians of Secondary 4/5 Students,

#### **WELCOME TO TERM 1 2023**

- 1. On behalf of the school and staff, we extend a very warm welcome to you in 2023! We hope that you have spent a meaningful and restful year-end holiday with your child/ward.
- 2. In the past year, Bowen Secondary celebrated our 40th Anniversary. Our theme, "BElonging, BEnefitting Lives, BElieving", reflected the three things that best represent the Bowen Experience, as well as the collective aspirations of our Bowen family. We look forward to writing the next chapter of the Bowen story together with our students, staff and stakeholders, and envision Bowenians who produce tomorrow's solutions for tomorrow's problems, through Collaboration, Connection, and Creativity. Your continued support for school directions and initiatives will be much appreciated.
- 3. As we embark on the new school year, we would like to provide you with key updates for Term 1 for our Sec 4/5 students.
- A. Update on Safe Management Measures (SMMs), Temperature-taking Exercise & First Week of School
- 4. Bowen will continue to implement any necessary SMMs in line with MOE Directions, to keep students and staff safe. While Singapore has successfully transitioned to living with Covid-19, we will remain vigilant in checking in on our students and safeguarding their well-being.
- 5. Please remind your child/ward to practice good personal hygiene (e.g. washing/sanitising hands) and exercise personal and social responsibility. If he or she is unwell (whether Ag+ or not), he / she <u>should</u> <u>not</u> come to school. Do inform his / her FTs and consult a doctor and / or follow the relevant Health Protocols (if Ag+).
  - In the event your child/ward has to miss school, his/her learning will be supported. FTs will
    assign a buddy to update your child/ward on the lessons and collect his/her worksheets.
    Please encourage your child/ward to be proactive in finding out on what he/she has missed
    from his/her buddy.
- 6. Temperature-taking will be carried out twice a year in 2023. In Term 1, all schools will carry this out on Wed 11 Jan. We would appreciate it if you could help remind your child/ward to bring a working thermometer on Tue 10 Jan for checking, and for use on Wed 11 Jan. Do also encourage your child/ward to continue bringing a thermometer (as well as a spare ART kit, if possible) to school so that he/she can monitor his/her health whenever necessary, given that social responsibility is now crucial in living with Covid-19.
- 7. FTs will also remind/update students on precautionary measures on the first day of school.
- 8. To ease the transition back to school, please take note of the dismissal time for your child/ward for the first week of school as follows:

## Learning Journey to Lifelong Learning Institute (LLEC)

This learning journey comprises a workshop and a tour of the institute to allow our students to gain more exposure to various careers based on 2 different themes (An Informed and Connected world, An Inclusive and Healthy World). Students will have the opportunity to try out 1 skills tester to understand a key skill that a professional uses in their area of work and they will be guided to map out possible tertiary education options based on the careers that they aspire.

# Personal Effectiveness and Mental Resilience Workshop

These workshops aim to create greater self-awareness of students' strengths, to help them reflect upon their learning strategies and to provide students with skillsets such as time management, stress management and how to encourage and tap on one another's strengths that allow them to better cope with the demands of this academic year.

## E. 2023 Home-based Learning

16. In 2021, MOE announced that schools would embark on Blended Learning (BL), which is a mix of home-based and in-school activities that leverage on both online and offline approaches to learning. The objective of BL is to nurture self-directed, independent and intrinsically motivated learners.

In Bowen, the Blended Learning experience includes a student initiated learning component called *BowenExplore!* on Home-Based Learning (HBL) Days where students explore their interests and passions and learn beyond the formal curriculum. Many students have found it a meaningful learning experience.

This year, the school will continue to have regular HBL days starting **Wed 25 Jan**. Please refer to the table below for the HBL schedule for 2023. An Info-Sheet with more details on HBL will be sent via PG at a later date.

#### F. Assessment and Criteria for Progression

- 17. In recent years, MOE has introduced several policy changes under the Learn for Life movement to nurture our students to be confident and resilient learners. From 2023, all schools will be removing mid-year examinations for all levels as part of ongoing efforts to inculcate the joy of learning in our students. Sec 4/5 will have Term Assessments (TA) in Terms 1 and 2 and Preliminary Examinations in Terms 3 and 4. TAs will take the form of either Pen-and-Paper (PP) tests or Authentic Assessments (AA).
- 18. More information on assessment matters will be sent to parents/guardians via Parents Gateway (PG) at a later date. Information on all academic matters including assessment will also be available in the e-Student Handbook (see Section H below).



#### G. Updates on School Attire

19. With the transition to living with Covid-19, mask wearing in school is optional. Students can choose to continue to wear a mask if they want to, but it is not mandatory. With the gradual return to normalcy, Bowen Secondary School will also revert to its original school dress code with effect from **Tue 3 Jan 2023**. Please refer to the updated guidelines below.

#### H. e-Student Handbook

21. With NDLP and the aim of imbuing greater student agency, the Student Handbook from 2023 will be in digital form. All students will receive the 2023 e-Student Handbook by Term 1 Week 4 via their Student ICON emails. The Handbook will include important information such as school rules, the school calendar, curriculum hours, and progression criteria.

#### I. Bowen Device (HP) Policy

- 22. With the availability of Personal Learning Devices and lockers for all students, they will be required to keep their handphones or any other electronic devices in their lockers during curriculum hours (which includes recess, CCA, etc.). Students can retrieve and use their handphones after curriculum hours/school dismissal at the canteen or foyer only.
- 23. Given the ubiquitous nature of technology, we hope that this practice will encourage our students to develop self-regulation in using technology wisely, "Disconnect to Connect" with their peers, reduce screen time, as well as prevent damage to, loss or theft of their devices. It will also allow them to better leverage their Personal Learning Devices as the main tool for learning without distractions from social media, game notifications and chats during curriculum time.
- 24. The school will be reminding students on the device policy and we believe that our students will be able to abide by it. However, there may be consequences (e.g. confiscation of handphone) should students be found flouting the rules.



25. The school seeks parents/guardians' support for the policy and help our students to use technology responsibly and appropriately. Should you need to contact your child/ward during curriculum hours due to any urgent matters, please contact the General Office at 6385 9466.

#### J. School Attendance and SMS Notification for Absenteeism

- 26. Attendance at school and school-related activities (e.g. CCA, Sports Day, Enrichment Days, etc) is compulsory to ensure students' holistic development and continuity of learning. Students who are absent must submit a valid medical certificate (MC) or a letter from parents with valid reasons immediately upon their return to school after their absence.
- 27. To ensure regular attendance, parents/guardians are encouraged to excuse their children from school through parent's/guardian's letters only for valid reasons such as unforeseen family circumstances. Thus the school will only accept up to 3 letters per term. If the student is unwell, we advise them to seek medical attention and be excused from school through an MC.
- 28. Students should not be travelling overseas during term time unless due to extenuating reason(s). Ongoing assessments may be impacted if student is absent from school without valid reason (e.g. no MC). - 29. Parents/guardians (i.e. primary contact person) will receive a SMS notification from school by 10.00am if your child/ward is absent from school. Kindly ensure your handphone number is updated in the school system through the Student Details Form (see Section J below).

#### K. Student Details Form

31. From 2023, the Student Details Form (SDF) will be digitalised and information will be sent to parents/guardians via Parents Gateway (PG) on **Wed 11 Jan**. Please confirm that the information is upto-date and respond online by **Tue 31 Jan**. For parents/guardians not onboard on PG, a hardcopy will be passed to you through your child/ward for verification. Should there be any changes, please update the form (indicate in red ink) and return it to FTs through your child/ward. As the form contains sensitive information, please remind your child/ward to keep the form safe and hand it to his/her FTs as soon as possible.

#### L. Canteen Matters

32. The school is currently changing the vendor of our Malay Noodles Stall, and the new vendor will need some time to commence operations. As a transitionary measure for the next few weeks, we have engaged our Malay Rice Stall vendor to prepare more food for students, including an expanded range of menu items such as Malay noodles. We will also be working on queue management to support our vendor as well as students buying Malay food. Nonetheless, you may wish to consider packing healthy snacks or other food that will not spoil easily, so that your child/ward can have his/her meal more readily during recess/lunch. Your understanding on this matter is very much appreciated.

- Your child/ward will be attending a <u>3-day</u> Applied Learning Module Programme on <u>11 13 January</u>
   2023 (Wednesday to Friday) at 8am 4pm on all days.
- 2. The aims of the programme are to expose students to possible careers that they may wish to pursue in the future, and to provide them an opportunity to experience actual practices used in the industries.
- 3. In 2022, your child/ward was given the opportunity to indicate his/her interests. After consolidation, your child/ward will be attending one of the six Applied Learning Modules below:
  - Aeronautics Engineering
- Food Culinary
- Healthcare & Nursing

- Entrepreneurship & Retail
- Photography
- IT (Digital Animation)
- 4. We will allocate modules taking into account students' choices, within the number of places offered by each module. Nonetheless, we will work with the students to make the most of their learning whichever module they are allocated.
- 5. The modules will be conducted based on the timing indicated above for all the three days. Students will report to school at 7.30 am as usual in school attire. The modules will be held in school and/or related external venue(s). More information will be provided to the students nearer the programme date. We seek your support in encouraging your child/ward to attend all three sessions and participate actively in all the activities. At the end of the modules, your child/ward will present/showcase what he/she has learnt, to practise his/her presentation skills. He/she will also receive a certificate of completion.
- 6. As MOE subsidises a portion of the cost (estimated cost: ~\$350), students will only co-pay \$25. This can be paid through their Edusave account. For students without an Edusave account or have insufficient funds in their Edusave account, payment can be made by cash or GIRO deduction. FTs will notify these students through the school bill.
- 7. Your child's/ward's attendance for this programme is **compulsory**. Should he/she miss any of the sessions without a valid medical certificate, disciplinary action will be taken against your child/ward and he/she may be liable to pay the full course fee.
