

You have worked hard to reach this stage. Let's celebrate our efforts!






Today marks the completion of that journey. You, our GEMies, shine brightly, each one of you having become a Masterpiece in your own right.

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
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Supporting Your Friend



GCE O-Level holders with the aptitude and interest to pursue the creative arts at the tertiary level may apply for diploma programmes at the Arts Institutions (AIs). Each AI runs its own admissions exercise, and interested students should apply directly to the institution.

The Als also run their own Early Admission Exercise, an aptitudebased admissions exercise open to graduating O-Level students, finalyear Nitec and Higher Nitec students from ITE and graduating Integrated Programme (IP) / International Baccalaureate (IB) Year 4 students. This exercise allows students to apply for and receive conditional offers for admission to NAFA and LASALLE prior to receiving their final grades.

DSA and EAE

Registration Process

- On the afternoon when the GCE
 O-Level results are released,
 students to look out for an email
 confirming their JAE eligibility.
- Students will receive Form A that lists their possible course options.

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Registration Process

- Students should use <u>the JAE</u>
 <u>Worksheet</u> to rank up to 12 courses based on their preference.
- This JAE worksheet is provided to assist students before they do their online course application.

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Registration Process

- After completing the JAE Worksheet, students can apply through the JAE Internet System (JAE-IS) with their Singpass during the application window (Fri 10 Jan, 4pm to Wed 15 Jan, 4pm)
- After submission, students will get a verification slip emailed to them via the JAE-IS.



JAE Posting Results

Students will receive their JAE posting on Tue 4 Feb via:

- <u>SMS</u> if students have provided a local mobile number.
- JAE-IS, to be accessed using their Singpass.



Points to note:

- JAE registration will open from <u>4pm on Fri 10 Jan and ends at</u> <u>4pm on Wed 15 Jan 2025.</u>
- 2. Students can submit their application through the JAE-IS at https://www.moe.gov.sg/jae using their SingPass (not parents).

Note: In the unlikely event that students do not receive their Form A via email (if they are eligible for JAE), students should log into the JAE Internet System (JAE-IS) using Singpass to download Form A during the JAE application period.



JAE Posting Results

If posted to a JC or MI course

 You will report to the school on the morning of Wed 5 Feb, in your secondary school uniform.

If posted to a polytechnic course

• You will receive an email with the enrolment instructions by end Feb.

If posted to an ITE course

• You will receive an email with the enrolment instructions on Tue 4 Feb.



Appeal Exercise after the official release of the posting results.

JC or MI

• To appeal for a place in JC/MI, students should approach the JC/MI directly. [must meet Minimum Entry Requirement and JC's COP]

Polytechnic or the ITE

 To appeal for a place in polytechnic or the ITE, apply on the <u>JAE Online</u> <u>Appeal Portal</u> (https://jaeappeal.edu.sg/) from Tue 4 Feb, 9am to Fri 7 Feb, 4pm.



Key Messages for JAE

1. Consider your course choice wisely

- 2024 Cut-off Points (COP) for the JCs/MI & Minimum Entry Requirements to Polytechnic courses under my School Finder or Course Finder
- In the JAE, applicants are posted to a course based on merit according to their net aggregate scores, taking into account the various bonus points eligible for (*i.e. net L1R5 for JC course, net L1R4 for MI course, net ELR2B2 for Polytechnics courses and net ELB4/ELR1B3/ELR2B2 for ITE courses*).
- It is important that you should consider courses that are comparable to your aggregate scores, for better fit and better chances of being admitted.

Key Messages for JAE

2. Make full use of your 12 choices

- Make a considered decision of all 12 choices because there is a change that you will be posted to one of them.
- Do check that you qualify for the course you are applying for.
- If you do not use up the 12 choices, you are limiting the number of choice you have in where you could be posted.
